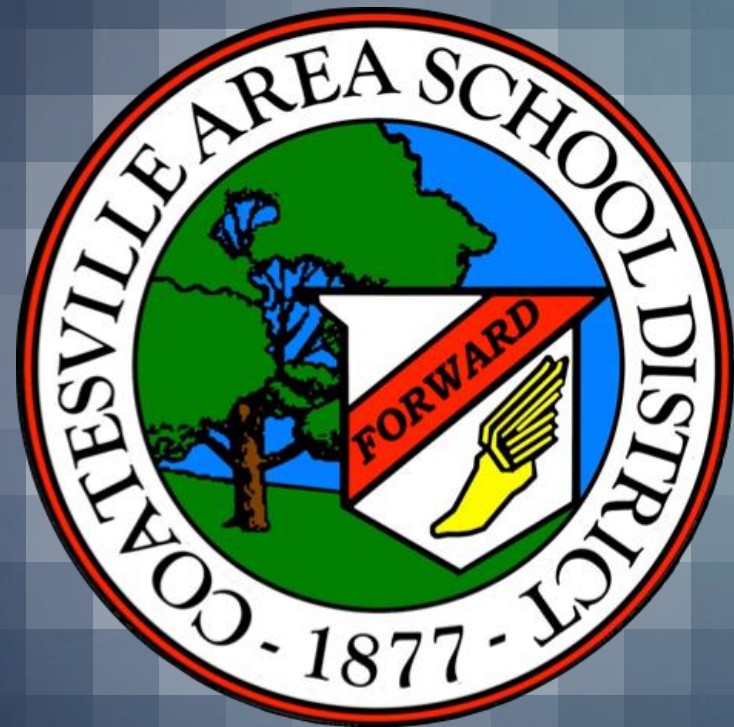

## ELEMENTARY SUMMER PROGRAM UPDATE

# General Information

- ▶ Location: Rainbow Elementary School
- ▶ Dates: 7/10/23-8/3/23, Monday-Thursday, 9am-noon
- ▶ Students: maximum of 45 students per grade level (class size  $\leq$  15 students)
- ▶ Staffing: 2 Lead Teachers, 18 Classroom Teachers (3 per grade level), 1 ESL teacher, daily administrator coverage



# Eligibility Criteria

- ▶ 45 lowest achieving students in each grade level
  - ▶ Receiving Tier 2 and 3 services
  - ▶ Focus of Intervention: Foundational Reading Skills
  - ▶ Mid-Year Acadience Reading Composite Score (RCS) in the Well Below Benchmark Range



# Communication

- ▶ Invitations were sent out in rounds.
- ▶ Initial invitations were mailed.
  - ▶ Invitations were sent in each family's preferred language.
- ▶ Follow-up/second copies were sent home with students.
- ▶ Each invitation was accompanied by a phone message, email, and/or text.
- ▶ Direct contact was made with every family prior to the due date for each round of invitations.

**Our goal was to fill as many seats as possible with our most vulnerable students.**

# Program Focus & Structure

- ▶ We want to support the whole child.
  - ▶ Daily instruction in reading and mathematics
    - ▶ Reading: Review key grade level skills/concepts, continue strategic/targeted instruction (Tier 2 and Tier 3 support), daily read-aloud, use of computer-based programs such as Lexia, summer reading initiative/assignments
    - ▶ Math: Review of key grade level skills/concepts, class-wide intervention using Spring Math, use of computer-based programs such as Xtra Math and IXL
  - ▶ Science/STEM opportunities
  - ▶ Social/Emotional Learning (SEL) opportunities
  - ▶ Arts and Technology opportunities



# Community Partnership

## **BELIEVE AND ACHIEVE FOUNDATION PARTNERSHIP AND GRANT**

- ▶ The grant will be used to pay for supplies for both the Title I summer program as well as elementary ESY programming. It will also be used to purchase supplies for community volunteers (NAACP partnership).

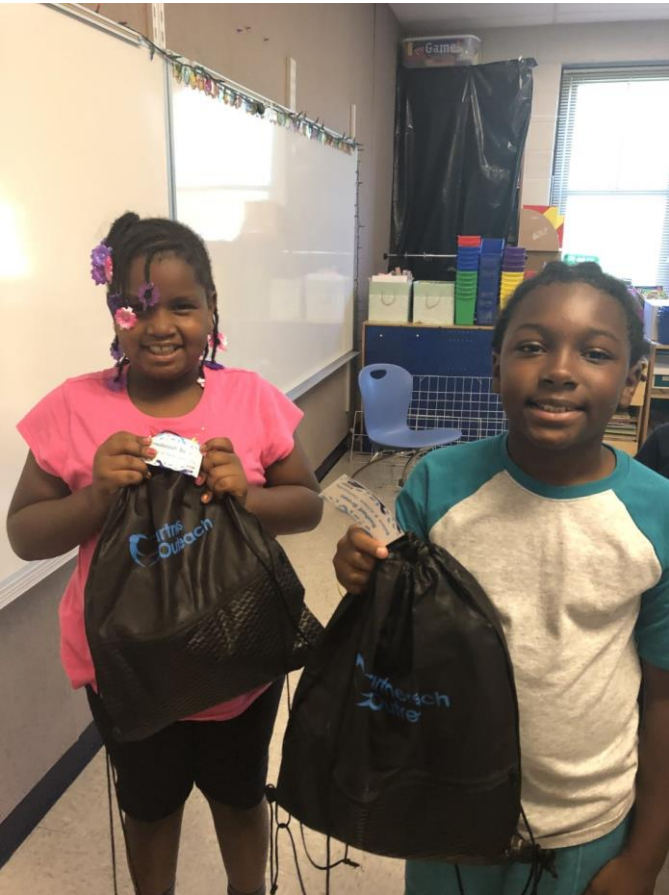

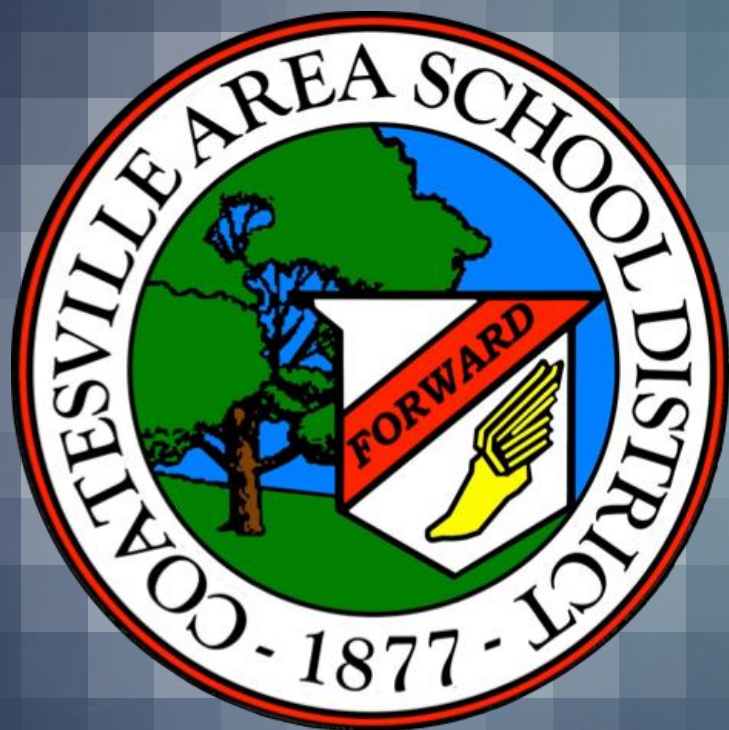
