Reading Workshop: This week in Reading Workshop, we will be wrapping up our nonfiction unit with an article about Amazon.com. Students were introduced to the article last week as they answered comprehension questions and became "text detectives" as they searched the article for evidence. This week they will use this article to identify text structure, main idea, and point of view. They will even acquire new vocabulary! The nonfiction assessment will take place on Thursday.

Writing Workshop: The students are going to be publishing their nonfiction writing pieces this week! They have been working hard writing nonfiction pieces about things they know a lot about!

Social Studies: This week in Social Studies, we will play Battleship to review letter-number grids. It is a modified version that can be easily played at home. The students will have a quick assessment this week to ensure they are able to locate places on a map using letter-number grids.

Mathematics: Our first fraction's unit is coming to an end! This Thursday the students will take their Unit 3 fractions assessment. They will be expected to add and subtract fractions and mixed numbers with like and unlike denominators, find the least common denominator (multiple) of two fractions, compare fractions, write equivalent fractions, and solve and write number stories involving fractions. This was not an easy unit, but I am very proud of the mathematicians in Room 122 for persevering and not giving up even when things get difficult. Our next unit in math will involve multiplication and division of fractions. Please continue to reach out to me with any questions or concerns you may have, especially when it comes to helping your son/daughter with his/her homework. I know it can be a struggle some days.
