Reading Workshop: The readers in Room 122 have been working on reading their books with "writerly-wide awakeness." This means reading their books knowing they will be doing some high-quality writing about their reading. We have been reading <u>Home of the Brave</u> by Katherine Applegate as a read aloud text. I also use this book to model some of the higher-level thinking 5th graders must do as they read. This week, we will prepare for our interpretation book clubs by reviewing inferencing. Miss Miehle and I are also continuing our DRA testing. We are about half-way done.

Writing: This week the students will be mailing their first pen pal letters to Colorado. Please send back the letter that was sent home last Friday if you do NOT wish to have your child's picture sent with the letter to his/her pen pal. If your child is choosing to bring a photo from home, they are due TOMORROW!

SCIENCE: This week Mrs. Elicker, our science teacher, will be continuing to teach the scientists in room 122 about communicative diseases. Last week they participated in an interactive lesson in which they saw how quickly germs can spread from one person to the next. Ask your child what they learned! Each science unit will be 10 consecutive days. Our first unit started last Friday and will end next Thursday (September 26th).

Mathematics: We are in full swing of Unit! This unit focuses heavily on area of 2-dimensional figures and volume of 3-dimensional figures. This week the students will be using cubes to find the volume of rectangular prisms. They will also learn two formulas when calculating volume. Remember to read the Unit! Family Letter that was sent home in the beginning of the unit. This letter is extremely useful when you are trying to help your child with homework. Not only does it have the answers to the Home Links (homework), but it also reviews the strategies/skills we will work on in class throughout the unit. In case you don't have it (or accidentally threw it away), I attached another copy of the family letter to this edition of "A Peek at Our Week.". I don't always copy it because the students are expected to rip it out of their Home Links book and give it to you. Be sure to check for a new Family Letter at the beginning of each unit.
