#### **Teachers Continually Learning Literacy Instruction**

Literacy outcomes are improving in the district, and we couldn't be prouder of our staff and students! In addition to realigning our district curriculum to the state standards, adopting a new core English Language Arts (ELA) program, and implementing an MTSS (Multi-Tiered Systems of Support) framework, the district has invested in several evidence-based reading intervention programs and is committed to training staff in evidence-based literacy instruction (the science of reading).

Earlier this month, a small group of special education teachers participated in their first instructional rally led by the CCIU. Teachers gained an understanding of how to apply new knowledge to assessment, instruction, and IEP development. The teachers are participating in a multi-year professional development series called Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling (LETRS).





Mrs. Jenna Czibik, an elementary Special Education Teacher says, "LETRS has changed the way that I teach reading. I have a deeper understanding of my students' challenges and what I can do through instruction to help wire their brains for reading. My awareness of reading difficulties and how they occur has allowed me to tackle reading in a new way."

This week, about 20 elementary staff members received training in RAVE-O, an evidence-based literacy intervention for students in grades 2-4. Dr. Kathleen Biddle and Dr. Donnelly Adams, two of the researchers that assisted with the development of the program, prepared staff to begin implementing the program. They will meet monthly with teachers to provide support through the end of the school year.



Ms. Casandra Jones, Curriculum Supervisor, can't wait to see the strides our students make with this new program. "Current research shows that 20% or 1 in every 5 people have dyslexia. While most students with dyslexia exhibit a deficit in phonological awareness skills, some present with multiple deficits which can make remediation more challenging. We are extremely excited to begin implementing the RAVE-O intervention along with a phonics-based intervention program to help our students make maximal progress."

#### Rainbow Elementary Hosts Winter Warm Up

It may be cold outside, but Rainbow Elementary was warm and cozy during the PTO Winter Warm Up! On Wednesday, December 14, Rainbow families celebrated the season with shopping, making holiday crafts, and enjoying a visit from Santa. 

# Rainbow Garden Club Makes Holiday Gnomes



The Board Meeting Schedule for the calendar year 2023 was approved. You can find that schedule here. One important change to note is that Board Meetings will now start at 6:00pm, which is an hour earlier than scheduled in previous years.

The School Board held elections for the President and Vice President positions for 2023. Robert J. Fisher was reelected to the position of President and Brandon J. Rhone was reelected to the position of Vice President. You can watch the vote here.
