

Remembering Henry Assetto



The Coatesville Area School District mourns the loss of former School Board member and lifelong educator, Henry Assetto. Mr. Assetto died peacefully at his home in Coatesville on December 5, 2021, at the age of 75. He will be remembered for a life of kindness and service to his students and community.

A passionate and talented educator, Mr. Assetto spent a total of 52 years in the classroom. He began his teaching career in Harrisburg Public Schools, but soon returned to his hometown of Coatesville where he taught at Gordon Middle School. Over the next 32 years, Mr. Assetto taught in the Coatesville Area School District where his list of accomplishments included being named National History Teacher of the Year in 1999. He also served as Awards Chair for the PA Council for Social Studies, was a Member of the House of Delegates National Council for Social Studies, a Member of the National Social Studies Instructional Committee, and a content advisor and editor with both McDougal Littell and Houghton Mifflin curriculum and textbook companies.

After a brief retirement from teaching, Mr. Assetto returned to the classroom at Twin Valley High School, as an inaugural faculty member of the Charter High School for Architecture and Design (Philadelphia, PA). Mr. Assetto was also a member of the Education Department at Longwood Gardens, where he served for 15 years in a role that combined his passion for education with his love and skill of gardening.

Mr. Assetto was a graduate of West Chester University, completed graduate work at Penn State University, and a Fellowship at Kings College of Oxford in England.

His life of service to his community continued through his tenure as an elected member of the Coatesville Area School Board for three and a half years (September 2018 - September 2021), until he fell ill.

Mr. Assetto was a devoted and loving family man. He is survived by his wife of 47 years, Angelina, and their five children and 10 grandchildren. He was known as an amazing cook and for his award-winning gardens. He was an active member of St. Peter Church in Coatesville. He was also an active member of The Men of Malvern at St. Joseph in the Hills - Retreat House, a Fourth Degree Knight of Columbus, and a member of the Order of Sons and Daughters of Italy.

Mr. Assetto will be deeply missed by his friends, family, students, and community. He left an indelible mark on the Coatesville Area School District, which extends its condolences to his family.

The Impact of Charter School Funding



The Coatesville Area School District recently received a request to pay two Charter Schools nearly \$5 million dollars based on a belief that CASD underpaid them during the last school year. We fundamentally disagree and plan to address this. Under the terms of Pennsylvania Charter School Law, the request made by the two Charter Schools could lead to funds being redirected from the CASD budget to the Charter schools. This was

an unexpected request that was not budgeted for this 2021-2022 fiscal year and would be detrimental to the operations of the CASD. The District is firm in its belief that the charter schools' legal position is clearly contrary to law, and the District will take the necessary steps to protect its interests and the interests of the residents of the District. While are hopeful that a resolution will be reached, the District will be steadfast in protecting its rights and interests.

As we continue to take on the issue of fair funding, our intent is to ensure law makers are reminded how the Charter School Law adversely impacts the District and your child's education. 
