




Chief Galbraith serves as the Director of Safety and Security and Chief of Police for Coatesville Area School District. Some of his notable accomplishments include:

- Researched, applied for and won grants to pay for officers and their equipment, security/technology/emergency preparedness programs, a new security gate and bulletproof vests.
- Implemented the Incident Command System in the district, taking administrative leadership through FEMA ICS 100, 200 and 700 training levels. He is currently planning for the 900 level.
- Developed close working relationships with the district's local police departments.

What is Design Thinking?

<u>Design Thinking</u> is a design methodology that provides a solution-based approach to solving problems. It's extremely useful in tackling complex problems that are ill-defined or unknown, by understanding the <u>human needs</u> involved, by re-framing the problem in human-centric ways, by creating many ideas in <u>brainstorming</u> sessions, and by adopting a hands-on approach in <u>prototyping</u> and testing. Understanding these five stages of Design Thinking will empower anyone to apply the Design Thinking methods in order to solve complex problems that occur around us — in our companies, in our countries, and even on the scale of our planet.









Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service



Coatesville Area School District would like to extend our thanks to the W.C. Atkinson Memorial Community Services Center, Inc. for thinking of our students when planning their Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service. They challenged local non-profits, faith-based & civic organizations, and community partners to join in a collaborative initiative to assist the Coatesville Area School District's COVID-19 relief efforts.

As the Omicron variant spreads throughout the nation, they recognized that the surge in positive cases has not only impacted adults;

but its rates have also been rising steadily among elementary & middle school-aged students. Dr. Vincent E. Miles, a W.C. Atkinson Board Member, said, "It was a "no brainer" for the W.C. Atkinson Center to take the lead and dedicate our Dr. MLK Day of Service efforts toward targeting these youth. The organizations [we reached out to] unanimously accepted our challenge!"

Assistance was provided through funding items such as children-sized masks, tissues, hand sanitizer, face shields, activity books (focused on COVID-19), crayons, and a book marker (that would feature Rev. Dr. M. L. King Jr., and local activist, Dr. W. C. Atkinson). As a result of these efforts, they were able to provide 250 bags of COVID-19 relief items to every elementary and middle school in the District. This donation will go a long way in the District's effort to keep our students safe. Thank you to all those who contributed.

Bugs for Lunch

Would you eat an insect? The AP Environmental Science class at CASH is currently discussing sustainable practices. To kickstart the unit, the students researched the sustainability of our current diet and agricultural practices. They also investigated more sustainable alternatives. In other words, instead of chicken or beef, try some bugs!

The purpose of the research was to compare how much water, land, and carbon it takes to produce 1 kg of wheat, insects, chicken, and beef. Not only did the students learn that it takes less land, water, and carbon to produce insects, but insects provide more protein per serving than beef. To culminate the research, the class held a "Bugs for Lunch" day. The students had the opportunity to eat various flavors of crickets and an assortment of other insects. In case you were wondering, "Hickory Smoked Bacon" crickets was this year's favorite. So, if you are looking to live more sustainably, try substituting your next batch of beef tacos for some Spicy Cayenne Cricket Tacos.

School Board Updates

The Coatesville Area School Board met on Tuesday, February 8, 2022. The full meeting agenda can be found here and you can watch the recording here.

The Education Committee approved the AFJROTC Crosstown Agreement, which will allow students from Downingtown Area School District to enroll and participate in the Coatesville High School Air Force Junior ROTC Program.

Enrollment reports run on January 31, 2022 show a decrease in Charter School Enrollment (-97) and an increase in CASD Enrollment (+141) over the previous year.

Superintendent Tomás Hanna and Director of Business Administration Lori Diefenderfer provided a 2022-2023 School District Budget Update which can be viewed here. The goal is to adopt a preliminary budget in April and a final budget in June.

One item on the Operations Committee Agenda was tabled during the meeting: "CCIU Bus Rodeo – Request to Waive Fees." President Fisher asked to table this item until there is further clarification on the custodial fees.

Several policies were approved during the Special Board Meeting. A public comment was made asking for formatting changes to improve consistency and accessibility for community members.

A public comment was made requesting that Muslim holidays be recognized as excused absences for students and that consideration be made in coming years for these holidays when planning the CASD School Year Calendar.

Chief Galbraith, the Director of Safety and Security and Chief of Police for Coatesville Area School District, was recognized as one of six finalists for Campus Safety Director of the Year. Thank you for all you do to keep everyone safe!
