





The goal of the program is to support the students throughout high school, so they have the support and encouragement to graduate and consider post-secondary education or training. Career Connection Academy is an initiative of the Chester County Economic Development Council (CCEDC).

Earlier this week, the Healthcare students received their own Stethoscopes & and learned about Blood Pressure while the STEM/Computer Science students visited Mr. Sheenan's classroom and learned about Coding and building their own video game.

"Reading Puts Me in My Green Zone" - Wear Green














