





She Said Yes!

SCIENCE-BASED ADDICTION PREVENTION

Last week, students at the Intermediate High School began work with Compass Mark, an organization that implements school-based drug and alcohol prevention services in Lancaster, Lebanon, and Chester counties. Students in grades 8 and 9 are engaging in the evidence-based program, CATCH My Breath. This program provides youth with information and the skills to resist peer pressure and media influences to try e-cigarettes and vaping.

Our students started their session with a forty-question survey about vaping, followed by a quick pre-test to check their knowledge about vaping. The presentations started with discussion and lecture and soon, the students quickly realized what they ingest when someone vapes and how dangerous it is. The biggest surprise to the students was that vaping materials include formaldehyde and various metals. The next few lessons will be extremely eye-opening to our students.
