Rainbow Elementary Celebrates Earth Day

Rainbow students celebrated Earth Day by participating in various Earth-centric activities. They had fun increasing their awareness of Earth Day and things we can do in our school, home, and community to help our planet!

Students in Mrs. Kaiser and Mrs. Thomas' class learned about the importance of keeping the Earth clean and recycling used materials. They worked together to make bird feeders using recycled toilet paper rolls, peanut butter, and bird seed. Students got to hang their bird feeders outside for the birds and other animals to enjoy!

Ms. Mathisen's 5th Grade Class learned all about Rainbow Elementary School. They learned about the special features of the building that make Rainbow a LEED gold certified building. Rainbow was the first public elementary school registered for LEED by a school district in Chester County. LEED measures green building performance in five categories: sustainable sites, water efficiency, energy & atmosphere, materials & resources, and indoor environmental quality. Ms. Mathisen's 5th grade class learned these interesting facts:

- All classrooms and most occupied spaces have natural daylight and views to the outside.
- Using occupancy sensors on lighting saves energy.
- Geothermal wells improve energy efficiency by using the constant temperature of the ground to assist in heating and cooling.

Honored for her outstanding talent in the performing arts.


Physicians and Nurses of Tomorrow Scholarship Award Recipient:

Substitute Superintendent Dr. Dunlap provided his Superintendent's Report by first introducing Dr. Celotto, Principal of Reeceville Elementary, for a presentation on their STEM program. He then addressed concerns about the adoption of Wit & Wisdom in grades 6-7.

Substitute Superintendent Dr. Dunlap and Director of Business Administration Lori A. Diefenderfer presented a <u>2022-2023 School District Budget Update</u>. That presentation can be heard <u>here</u>.

The Board of School Directors approved the Resolution adopting a Preliminary Budget for the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year and provided notice of a Special Board Meeting on June 14, 2022 for Final Budget Adoption.
