CASH Preschool Students Have Fall Fun

Our amazing CASH Preschool, taught by our Child Development students in grades 10-12, under the tutelage of Ms. Tracey Parker, has been in existence for over 35 years.

Each year during student course selection, our students in grades 10-12 can sign up for Child Development. Child Development is a 1.0 credit course. Students learn about the theories surrounding a child's development and then apply those theories to our preschool laboratory here at CASH that is comprised of local children ages 3-5.

Daily, our preschoolers get to experience: Circle Time, Math, Science, Language Arts, Art, Story Time, Large Muscle and Sensory Time, all while gaining social, intellectual, physical, and emotional skills.

McGraw-Hill Supports Open Court Reading Implementation



Students in Mrs. Swisher's first grade class at King's Highway Elementary were fully engaged during a whole group phonics lesson with McGraw-Hill consultant Denise Williams.

Teachers in grades K-5 received additional coaching to support implementation of Open Court Reading, the district's new core ELA series for elementary students.

Denise Williams, a consultant for McGraw-Hill, visited 42 classrooms across the K-5 division and modeled lesson procedures and instructional routines for staff. Modeling is such a critical component of instruction, and it is no different for teachers who are learning to implement a new program with fidelity. Teachers reported that the opportunity to observe Denise was very helpful.

Additional coaching and support will be provided throughout the school year.

Caln Fifth Graders Explore Art at the Museum

Caln Elementary fifth graders took a field trip to the Brandywine River Museum with their art teacher, Ms. Wilson. When they returned to school, the students had to recreate one of the works of art they observed that day by drawing, playacting, or working with clay. Everyone had a great time!

Students in kindergarten have been studying pumpkins and their life cycle. They have explored what sinks and floats, compared them to the way apples grow, and even watched them rot! They read fiction and nonfiction books about pumpkins and incorporated them into math lessons.

Last week, students measured their pumpkins, counted their ribs, and counted handfuls of seeds. Those seeds went home with the kids to continue the life cycle in the spring. We didn't forget the sense of taste in our studies. Students tasted roasted pumpkin seeds as well!

Employee Spotlight Delores Hines East Fallowfield



Interim Superintendent Dr. Dunlap was unable to attend this Board meeting, so there was no Superintendent's Report.

Dr. Eugenia Roberts, the proud principal of North Brandywine Middle School, led a presentation to the School Board about all the great things they are accomplishing there. This presentation included recognizing students for their academic and activity achievements, music from their school band, and a performance from their cheerleaders. CAIHS Principal Cliff Maloney provided the Board with additional information regarding the SmartPass hall pass system.
