## Scott 6th Grade Mental Health Fair

On Friday, November 4, the 6<sup>th</sup> graders at Scott participated in a Mental Health Fair. Organizations such as the YMCA, the Community Youth and Women's Alliance (CYWA), the Child Guidance Resource Center, the Chester County Food Bank, the Coatesville Youth Initiative (CYI), and the CCIU provided students with a variety of opportunities to discuss and learn coping strategies for stress.

The students practiced yoga and breathing exercises, received stress balls and identified what causes stress for them before shooting their stress ball into a basket as a form of stress release, took a stress test and colored a coloring page with a motivational phrase, discussed a healthy diet and ate apples while they spun a wheel for prizes, and talked about ways to manage stress. Students were engaged throughout the event and took away many great tips to use in the future!


#### **Elementary STEM Classrooms Receive iPads**



The STEM curriculum is currently being finalized and will be presented to the School Board approval in the coming months.

Once they illustrated the scene, they labeled aspects of their drawing with the beginning sounds of the words they wanted to use. These students were very observant and are already showing great attention to detail in their descriptive writing!







#### Mobile Classroom Visits East Fallowfield



The Mobile Agriculture
Education Science Lab paid a
visit to East Fallowfield
Elementary during the first
week of November. The lab
travels across Pennsylvania,
visiting schools and bringing
the experience of being on a
field trip straight to school
grounds. Each class was able
to visit the mobile classroom
and engage in a hands-on
STEM-based science
experiment.

Miss Lombardo's second grade class conducted an experiment comparing two types of crayons: Crayola and Prang. They learned about the difference between renewable and non-renewable resources and their impact on our environment. Prang crayons are primarily made from soybean oil, which is a renewable resource and better for the environment than crayons that utilize petroleum oil for production, which is a

non-renewable resource.

Students made predictions, conducted an experiment where they colored two sides of a picture with different brands of crayons, and drew conclusions about what they observed in terms of the brightness, flakiness, and coverage of each brand of crayon. The class favorite based on those factors was the Prang crayon! Our students were excited to participate in the experiment and had a great experience in the mobile classroom!








#### Four Student Athletes Sign Letters of Commitment


