

# Spring Season Welcomes New Life in CASD Schools





Throughout this unit, classes have studied the science of the chicken embryo. They watched the embryo grow inside the egg until it hatched as a chick and monitored the temperature, humidity, and rotation of the eggs for 21 days. Our students learned the parts of the egg, made observations each day, and witnessed the chicks develop over time. In addition to the growth cycle, they also learned about agriculture, commodities, and supply and demand.



Once the chicks had hatched and warmed up, they enjoyed gentle cuddles from the students who were eager to meet them! Many of the chicks will move to a local farm, but a few will get to go home with students who have proved that they have the knowledge, supplies, and environment necessary to provide a good home.
