## **Teams Compete in STEM Design Challenge**

How can we engineer solutions to the environmental issues impacting our world? Teams of fifth and sixth graders from King's Highway, Rainbow, and Scott tackled this question as part of the recent STEM Design Challenge hosted by the Chester County Intermediate Unit. Under the direction of Miss Kaptur, Gifted Education Teacher, teams spent several months moving through each stage of the engineering design process, from brainstorming problems, to researching existing solutions, to prototyping and testing their own creative ideas. Using K'Nex, teams built a variety of inventions from tree-planting robots to boats that filter trash out of the ocean.

Six teams were selected to showcase their teams' prototypes, design process, and blueprints in a live competition with teams from around the county. The team "Winner's Cub" from King's Highway including Paul Carpenter, Ian Porter, and Cameron Schwenk received first honorable mention (fourth place) in the elementary division and were commended by the judges for their impressive creativity and problem solving shown in their trash-collecting beach robot. Congratulations to all of our future engineers who showcased the teamwork and innovation that make Coatesville great!










# All 5 CASD Elementary Schools Receive National Recognition for Commitment to Empowering Students



Coatesville Area School District's five elementary schools have been recognized as a 2022-23 Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Distinguished Schools. They are 5 of the 492 schools across the United States to receive this honor for providing broad access to transformative learning experiences for students through PLTW Launch. <a href="PLTW">PLTW</a> is a nonprofit organization that serves millions of PreK-12 students and teachers in schools across the U.S.

The PLTW Distinguished School recognition honors schools committed to increasing student access, engagement, and achievement in their PLTW

programs. To be eligible for the designation, schools had to have more than 75 percent of the student body participating in the program and had to offer at least one PLTW Launch module at each grade level during the 2021-22 school year.

"We are proud to recognize Caln Elementary, East Fallowfield Elementary, King's Highway Elementary, Rainbow Elementary, and Reeceville Elementary for their commitment to providing students with exceptional educational experiences while ensuring equitable access to PLTW programs," said Dr. David Dimmett, PLTW President and CEO. "We congratulate them on this achievement and celebrate their important work empowering students with the knowledge and skills to succeed, not only in STEM subjects, but also more generally in life and career."


## **Wrestlers Receive Statewide Academic Recognition**


### **Coatesville Youth Initiative Hosts Mental Health Fair**

COATESVILLE AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT **PARENTS AND STUDENTS:** GET READY TO SHOW WHAT YOU KNOW!

The PSSA's and Keystone Exams are coming up this spring.

Coatesville must have enough students taking these exams to fulfill our PA Department of Education requirements.

#### Who takes these tests and when?

Grades 3-8

Pennsylvania students in grades 3 through 8 take the PSSA in English Language Arts and Math, given over a period of a few weeks in the spring.

Grades 4 & 8 Fourth and 8th graders also take the Science & Technology PSSA test

**High School** 

The Keystone exams are given in high school, in the subjects of Algebra 1, Literature, and Biology. In some cases, younger students who have taken these classes may take the tests, generally at the end of the course. They are offered in the winter, spring and summer. Students with high scores on Advanced Placement Algebra, Biology or Literature courses can skip the Keystone test in that subject.

#### How are the test results used - why do they matter?

Under state requirements, the PSSA scores are used to evaluate teachers and schools. The scores factor into a school's rating on the state's School Performance Profile ultimately can impact a school district's future

Beginning with the Class of 2023, students must demonstrate proficiency on the Algebra I, Literature, and Biology Keystone Exams to graduate or they must fulfill one of the alternate pathways to graduation. Students will be offered multiple opportunities to take the Keystones throughout their high school career.
