DCCC DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

- Open to Coatesville HS students in Grades 10 through 12
 - Students can register and earn up to 60+ credits (Associates Degree) if they start in their 10th grade year.
 - Associate Degree completion requires students to take courses in the Summer sessions, which are not paid for by CASD.
 - Students will receive the reduced rate to attend these courses.

Dual Enrollment Application Process

- Student submits DCCC application, Dual Enrollment agreement form and high school transcript to DCCC for review (application fee is waived!)
 - Applications are available online through the Delaware Community College Website
- Accuplacer test administered
 - Testing will be scheduled through CASH dates TBD
- The ability of the program depends on grades, GPA, attendance, and the Accuplacer exam (more information will be shared during the breakout session).

- AP grades in High School are *weighted*



SAT Testing

All 10th grade students and 11th grade students take the PSAT at no cost in the Fall.

All 11th grade students take SAT in March.



TESTING SEQUENCE RECOMMENDATION

• GRADE 10

- All students take the PSAT (no cost) in mid-October
- Results are returned in November

• GRADE 11

- All students take the PSAT (no cost) in mid-October
- Results are returned in November
- Register for February ACT*
- March SAT at CASH*
- Register for January and/or May SAT*

* Tests are given at CASH

TESTING SEQUENCE RECOMMENDATION

• GRADE 12

- Check college websites for SAT/ACT requirements
- Most colleges ask for a senior year score
- Do <u>not</u> wait for score results to apply to college!
- Some colleges require electronic score submission
- Many colleges may also require placement exams

Work Release

- Senior students who have earned:
 - 19 credits in the correct subjects and who are in good standing to graduate
 - Maintain good discipline and attendance records
 - Responsible for providing their own transportation to and from the work site
 - The privilege of driving to school with the purchase of a parking permit
 - Obtain a paid employment position at a local business or organization
 - Complete the application process
 - Maintain employment in good standing

Volunteer Internship

- Senior students who have earned:
 - 19 credits in the correct subjects and who are in good standing to graduate
 - Maintain good discipline and attendance records
 - Responsible for providing their own transportation to and from the work site
 - The privilege of driving to school with the purchase of a parking permit
 - Obtain unpaid internship position at a local business or organization
 - Complete the application process
 - Maintain employment in good standing
 - Comply with all of the internship regulations established by the outside agency.

Senior Privilege

- Senior students who have earned:
 - 19 credits in the correct subjects and who are in good standing to graduate
 - Maintain good discipline and attendance records
 - Be enrolled in 2 AP or Dual Credit Courses
 - Responsible for providing their own transportation to school
 - The privilege of driving to school with the purchase of a parking permit
 - Complete the application process
 - Arrive on time for the beginning of period 2 3 lates will result in loss of privilege.

Work Release/Volunteer Internship

- Work Release = 1 credit for 10 hours of work/week
- Work Release = 2 credits for 20 hours of work/week
- Volunteer Internship = 1 credit for 10 hours of volunteer time per week.
- Senior Privilege does not earn credit towards graduation or GPA.
