Reading Specialist certification.



Homework Each day, your child will have the opportunity to copy their homework assignments in their agenda. Essentially they are expected to complete the math worksheet from that day's lesson, read for at least 20 minutes, practice their Word Sorts (spelling words) sufficiently to earn a 90% or greater on their Spelling Test. If there is a holiday or other reason for no homework, they will write "No Homework" in the subject area for that day. I will ask that you <u>sign the agenda each night</u> to communicate to me that you have seen and reviewed their homework. This allows us to continue growing our learning the next day.
