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## **Robotics Team Makes Face Shields**

The Coatesville Area School District Robotics team, in conjunction with Serv-I-Quip, Inc., has been making face shields to donate to medical personnel on the front lines in the war against COVID-19.

The face shields are made with donated overhead project slide material and 3-D printers are used to print the headband section. To date, over 400 face shields have been manufactured and distributed to doctors, nurses, ambulatory and EMS staff, and one soon-to-be new father.

The face shields have been donated to facilities such as hospitals, fire companies, and doctor and dental offices. Some local recipients are Brandywine, Bryn Mawr, and Paoli hospitals as well as the VA hospital, Chester County Dental Arts, and Bayada Home Health Care Services.

This team was supposed to be heading to "Worlds for Worlds" Robotics Competitions in April in Detroit, Michigan. However, the COBO center has been turned into a makeshift hospital for those sick with the COVID-19 virus. This team is now competing against the invisible enemy in a fight to prevent the spread of the virus.

#### **2020 Census Information**

#### What is the Census?

The United States Census is a national SURVEY conducted every 10 years by the U.S. Census Bureau to COUNT the population and is required by law. The survey has nine questions and takes about 10 minutes. The questions are simple:

- How many people were living in your house on April 1, 2020?
- Do you rent or own your home?
- Gender, race, age, ethnic group, and relationship to you?

The survey asks for people's names to ensure that each household member is counted only once. Names are replaced with a random # when your information is input, and NO PERSONAL INFORMATION is shared with any other federal agency, including ICE and law enforcement.

## Why does being counted matter?

For Chester County, EACH person counted, including newborns and children, brings approximately \$2,093 into your Community,

every year for 10 years! This money funds programs like Special Education, Head Start, SNAP (food stamps), Section 8 housing and Women's Infants and Children (WIC), plus health programs serving our veterans, seniors, and the most vulnerable populations in our community. And with the unprecedented impact of COVID-19, we need those funds more than ever!

The Census data also help determine where new roads, supermarkets and schools will be needed in your Community.

#### How do I take the survey?

You have 3 options: You can use the *paper* form mailed to you, or go *online* at <a href="https://www.cencus.gov">www.cencus.gov</a>, or call and complete your survey on the phone:
