Summary Statement: The school guidance counselor promotes the overall development of students from kindergarten to sixth grade in the academic, career, and personal/social areas.

Essential Functions:

Strength

- Hearing- Perceiving the nature of sounds. Used for those activities which require ability to receive detailed information through oral communication,

and to make fine discriminations in sounds, such as when making fine adjustments on running engines.

Vision

- Near Acuity- Clarity of vision at 20 inches or less. Use this factor when special and minute accuracy is demanded.

- Depth Perception Three-dimensional vision. Ability to judge distances and spatial relationships so as to see objects where and as they actually are.

- Field of Vision Observing an area that can be seen up and down to right or left while eyes are fixed on a given point. Use this factor when job performance requires seeing a large area while keeping the eyes fixed.
