## PUBLIC COMMENT

The uniform survey sent to parents excluded the "opt out" question. Ms. Lovelace feels that the uniform policy should be elementary-wide and that Friendship should not be the only school subjected to this policy.

Of the $80 \%$ responders to the uniform survey; $67 \%$ were in favor of students wearing uniforms, nearly $20 \%$ were against it. Almost $20 \%$ did not respond.
